FROM THE PRESIDENT:



It seems only a few days ago that I wrote to you for last year's annual report. Time certainly does fly, doesn't it? I think it is safe to say that we have been very busy at Southern Crescent

Technical College! Almost 14,000 individuals were served by all campuses of Southern Crescent last year, and together they took almost a quarter of a million credit hours. Around 68 percent of them took both an in-person and an on-line course of one type or another. We graduated 1,789 students who earned 2,509 different credentials. Of those, 389 were associate of applied science degrees — a significant accomplishment.

In order to accomplish all of this, we took in almost \$28,000,000 and spent over \$27,000,000. We have one of the largest economic impacts of any institution in our ten-county community service area. We are projecting our annual operating budget for FY 12 to be in the neighborhood of \$25,000,000.

Looking forward into Fiscal Year 2012, we will convert all of our academic schedules from the historical 10-week quarter system to a new 16-week semester system. That means that in the last year, the curriculum, the class outlines, the course syllabi and the college catalog have been rewritten completely. All

of our policy manuals have been revised, and many of our operating procedures have been changed to accommodate the new calendar. We are eagerly anticipating this transition and are looking forward to the new challenges and opportunities ahead.

We are also looking forward to a new athletic year, starting with our new NJCAA affiliation in the basketball season. Our first game will be against Gordon College, our companion institution just down the road in Barnesville. We need everyone to support our Tiger athletes!

In all, our year just past has been eventful and productive. We look forward into the new FY with eager anticipation — what will the new year bring? I'm not certain that I know, but I am certain that we are all excited to see it. I can make this promise — the same promise I made last year. We will never compromise on quality or integrity, and if you hire our students/graduates, you will be getting a quality worker who has been well trained. And if you are one of our graduates, you can depend on Southern Crescent Technical College to stand behind you, as we always have.

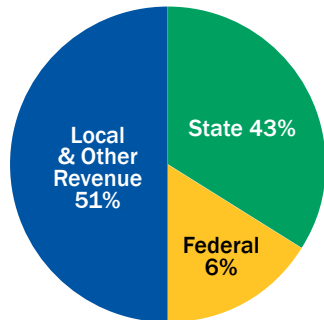

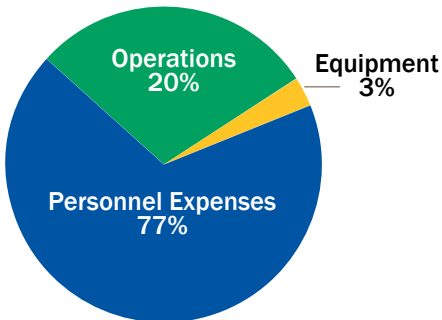
