From The President



Once more we come to the end of a fiscal year where we look back at all the activities, opportunities, and successes of the past year. I hope you will realize from this report the depth and frequency

of the changes in the lives of the people who came through the doors of Southern Crescent Technical College. After all, changing people's lives is our primary business. Within this year-end report, you will find our statistical information, such as how much we spent and how many students were trained. In addition, you will be introduced to some of the fantastic successes our students and faculty have achieved over the past year.

We underwent some dramatic transformations as an institution last year as well. When we began the summer term, we were beginning the final quarter that SCTC would ever conduct with the fall marking our transition from quarters to semesters. Along with that change, the rules governing the HOPE Grant and Scholarship changed, requiring our students to contribute more money out of pocket than they had ever been asked to do before. Summer semester brought more notable changes as the Pell Grant rules changed and made a significant impact on how students could pay for their education. While all these changes were on-going, as an institution we accommodated another significant budget cut from the state appropriation. Through each change, our staff, faculty, and students took each

challenge in stride and performed with pride and determination, as I would expect. We finished the year with more students than the year before, and in the summer term, students took over 48% more credit hours than in the same period a year earlier. Once again, we provided a superior quality technical education, while receiving and spending fewer dollars than the year before. We also saw progress on our new Medical Technology building, which we will occupy Spring Semester 2013. Much of this is attributable to those of you who will read this annual report, and we recognize that your interest and support have been fundamental to our success. As I have said over and over, we could not do what we do without you doing what you do for us. For that, we thank you for all your continued support.

All in all, how could I be anything but proud of what transpired this year? Maintaining a high level of quality, while using fewer resources, and seeing the potential of new facilities and equipment arriving daily were thrilling experiences. What's more, it looks as though the coming year holds the same promise along with similar challenges. With your support and assistance, I am confident in our ability to deal with the coming challenges, and I am excited about the possibilities that another new year brings to us all. I look forward to the experience, and I cannot wait to see what unfolds next!

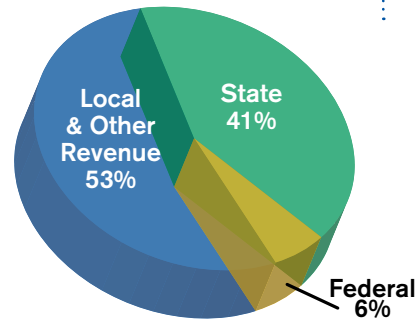

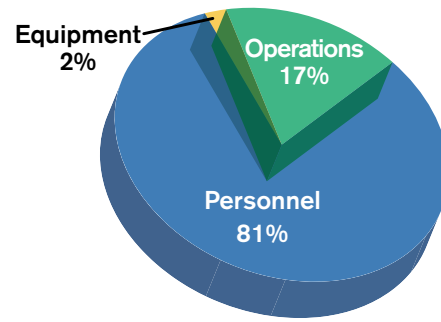
