Dear Friends of Southern Crescent Technical College,



n behalf of the more than 5,000 faculty, staff, and students of Southern Crescent Technical College, I invite you to enjoy the accomplishments of the College that are highlighted in our Fiscal Year 2016 annual report. As you read the report, you will see the enormous impact that the College has on our students and the communities that we serve.

I would like to thank Dr. Randall Peters, former President of Southern Crescent Technical College who retired in December of 2016, for the outstanding leadership that he provided the College. As the new President of Southern Crescent Technical College, it

is my privilege to build on his legacy and initiatives and plan and implement new initiatives for the College. The College has a great history of leadership, and I am honored to continue that tradition.

Each year we update you on the many successes of the past year. I am pleased to relate to you a few of the highlights of Fiscal Year 2016 in this annual report.

During the last year, the College served 11,568 credit students, who took over 97,992 credit hours, for a total of 6,531 FTE (full-time equivalents). We are currently working to create stronger processes and streamline our systems to make

it easier for students to enroll and complete their programs of study. In addition to our credit instruction, the College served 162 companies performing over 15,000 hours of training.

Our Henry County Center development continues as we plan for the second instructional building. We have finished the plan for the new 82,000 square foot facility and should begin construction soon.

I am excited to report that our new Associate Degree Nursing program was approved by all agencies, and the first class of RN students began Spring Semester 2017. In addition, we were also successful in gaining final approval for our first fully transferrable Associate of Science Degree in Consumer Economics, which will enable students to transfer to the University of Georgia Griffin Campus as juniors. This degree also began Spring Semester 2017.

As you read the annual report, you will find numerous success stories. I remain very proud of the impact that Southern Crescent Technical College continues to make in the lives of our students. Our impact is permanent, positive, and generational. The futures of families are being changed daily by the faculty and staff at the College, and our communities are stronger for our efforts and results.

Lastly, I want to thank all of our stakeholders and supporters who have helped to make the College the valued contributor to our communities that we have become. We cannot do what we do without your steadfast support and you are a vital part of all of the successes of Southern Crescent Technical College.


Mary Holmes CULINARY ARTS STUDENT

The Foundation also exists to improve the image and expand community awareness of Southern Crescent Technical College. The Foundation's mission, goals, and objectives are consistent with the philosophy, purpose, and strategic plan of the College.

The Southern Crescent Technical College Foundation, Inc., is incorporated under Georgia Law and is financially and organizationally separate from the College. It is classified as a 501(c) (3) organization under the Internal Revenue Code and gifts received may be tax deductible.
